A letter of intent stating the applying teacher's case for why they should receive this Scholarship, including a clear outline of areas of need in their school's English/Drama programme and stating ways in which the teacher will become an advocate for the practical teaching of Shakespeare in their school and their region.

### **Attachment 2) Head Teacher OR Deputy Principal OR teaching colleague reference\***

A letter of recommendation demonstrating the potential value of the Scholarship to the teacher and the teaching community of the school.

### **Attachment 3) Principal's reference\***

A letter of recommendation from the Principal, including a commitment to the continued support and provision of resources for the teaching of Shakespeare in their school community.

*\*Teachers at schools without the personnel above may provide references from other referees of equivalent status.*
